when I did he'd found out from other sources."

Collins said when he first took office this spring he told Bennett, since Bennett had mentioned his retirement, that the

village had a number of applicants for the job.

The police chief is a mayor-appointed position in Plainfield, hired with the approval of the village board.

It could take some time to find a suitable candidate for the job, Collins said. When asked whether he would appoint a new

chief before July, Collins said he did not want to put a timeline on the process.

To save money, Collins said he decided to start with the five applicants, who he declined to name, instead of starting a large-scale search.

In July, village officials hired Village Administrator Brian Murphy, who

moved to Plainfield from Michigan, after a national search for applicants.

"The candidate will be the best we can get for the position," Collins said. "I am cognizant of the importance of this position. I'm not taking this lightly. And neither are the two (village police) commissioners."
